Description	In this session, distinguished Panelists from the corporate business community, public accounting and legal groups will discuss in an interactive setting amongst themselves and the audience escheat issues facing Illinois businesses and insight on best practices to comply and mitigate risks. In a world of continuous accounting and tax climate change, unclaimed property is no stranger. While most Illinois businesses have been focused on federal tax reform and its SALT implications along with Wayfair paradigm shift, unclaimed property has had its changes as well particularly in Illinois (law change effective 1/1/18) and Delaware (law change enacted 2/3/17), enforcement of which is expected in 2019 and beyond. The Uniform Law Commission adopted new RUUPA (model escheat acts) in 2016 that is expected to grab attention of more states for adoption in the coming years as well. Whether it's the new statutory framework in IL and DE, or the ULC provisions to be adopted by others, there remains sharp debate as to the purpose of unclaimed property laws; many holders say it is nothing short of corporate extortion or a money grab by states to plug budget deficits while states argue they audit and collect these funds with the intent to return them to the rightful owner.
